
Steps to Find Your Lost Dog

Appeal to your dog's sense of smell.

Immediately put out food, water, and your dog's bed or an article of your clothing at the location where your dog was last seen.





Use signs and flyers.

Post large, brightly colored signs with your pet's picture and your phone number. Create flyers and go door to door in the neighborhood where your pet was last seen. You can create a free flyer at PetFBI.org.

Do NOT Chase.

Instruct everyone who is helping you to notify you if they spot your dog and NOT to chase. If you see your dog, sit or lay down, don't make eye contact, and gently toss out treats to lure your dog to you.







Contact animal control, animal shelters, vet clinics, and your local police departments. If your pet is microchipped, contact the microchip company to let them know your pet is lost and to verify that your contact information is current. Visit your local shelters in person.

Use social media and the Internet.

Post on PetFBI.org, Nextdoor.com, the lost and found section of Craigslist, neighborhood Facebook pages, and other lost and found social media sites.
